the Crime-Fighting Cat On Bullies



Tell a teacher or your parents; don't be afraid.


They will most certainly come to your aid.




If you know someone who's being picked on stick around and help 'till the bully is gone.

Stick up for your buddies and show them you care.




If you notice someone who doesn't fit in because of their clothes or their color of skin, imagine yourself in the other kid's shoes and stick up for them. You have nothing to lose.

If you all stick together, soon the bully will be gone.




Bullies are cowards. They are not really brave. They act real tough, but it's no way to behave. No one should be bullied because it's no fun, so keep telling someone until something is done.




Molly looks out the window. She sees her teacher waiting for her. She met her the day before. Molly takes a deep breath and gets off the bus.



Molly and her teacher wait for a few more children from the class. When everyone arrives, they walk to the classroom.






