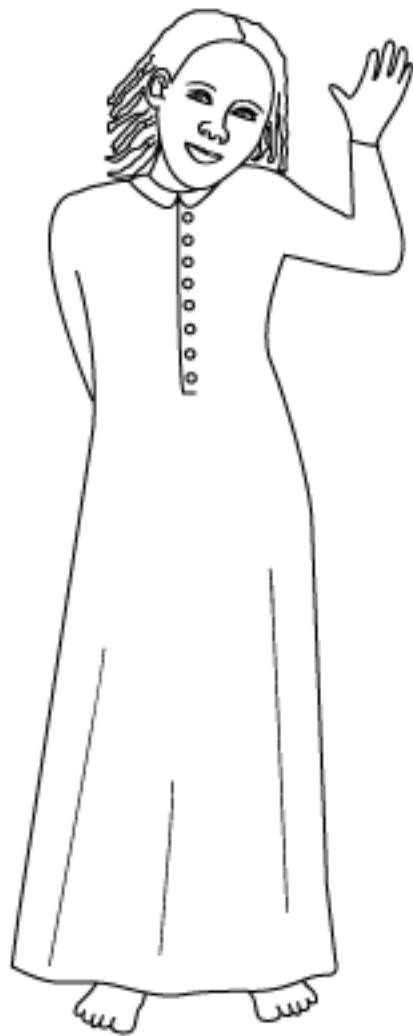
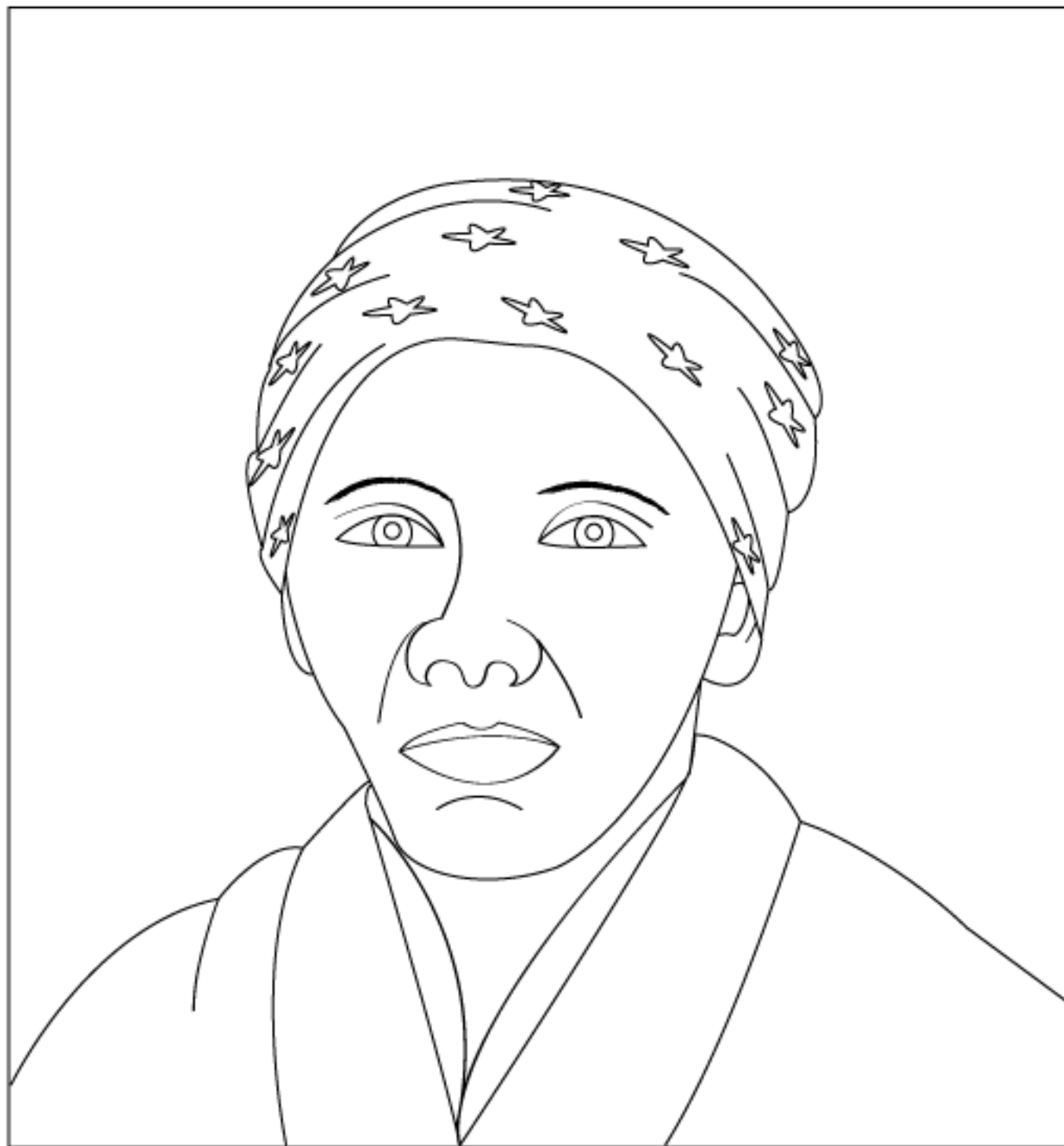


A Slave Girl Named Harriet

be free.

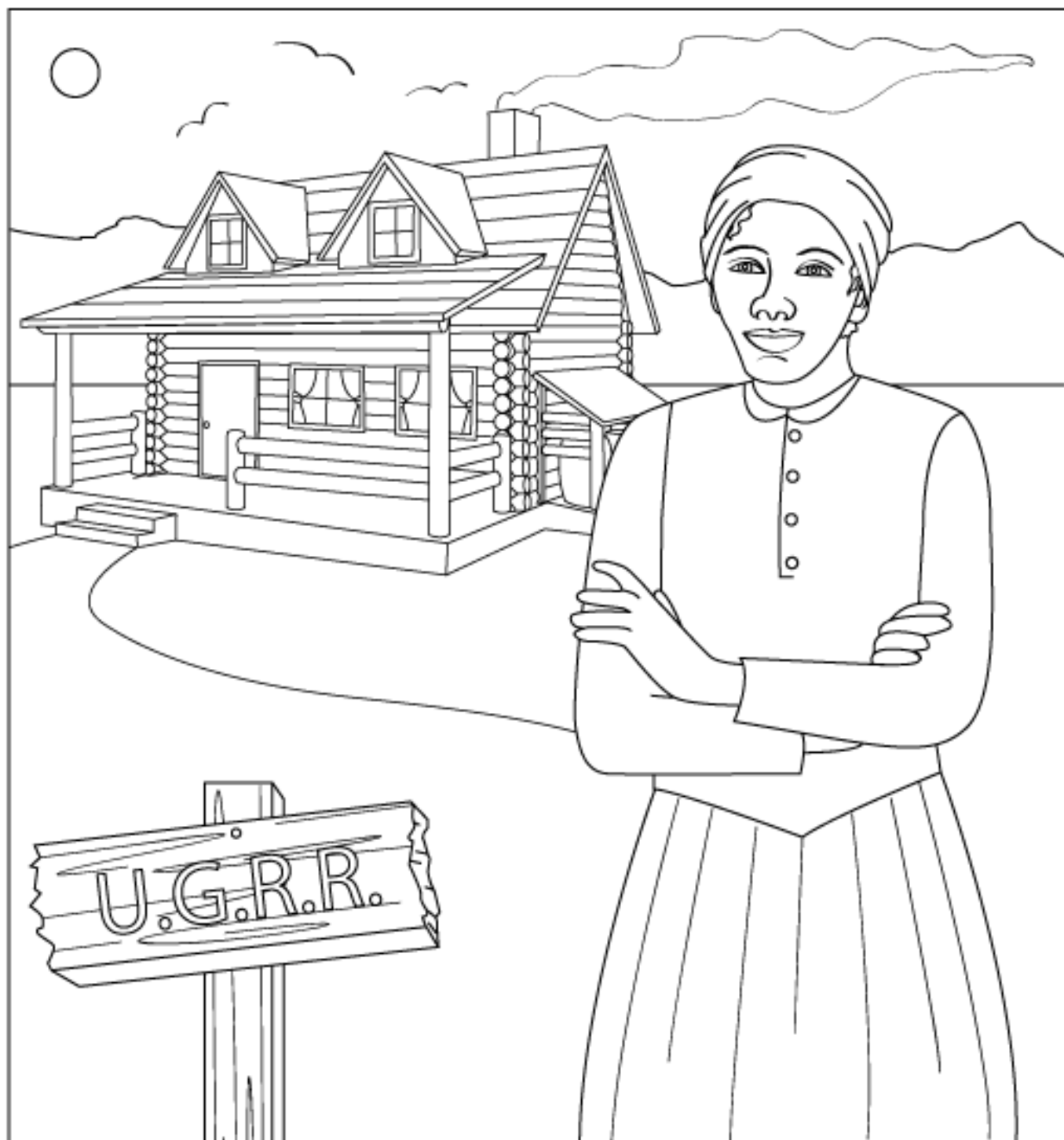

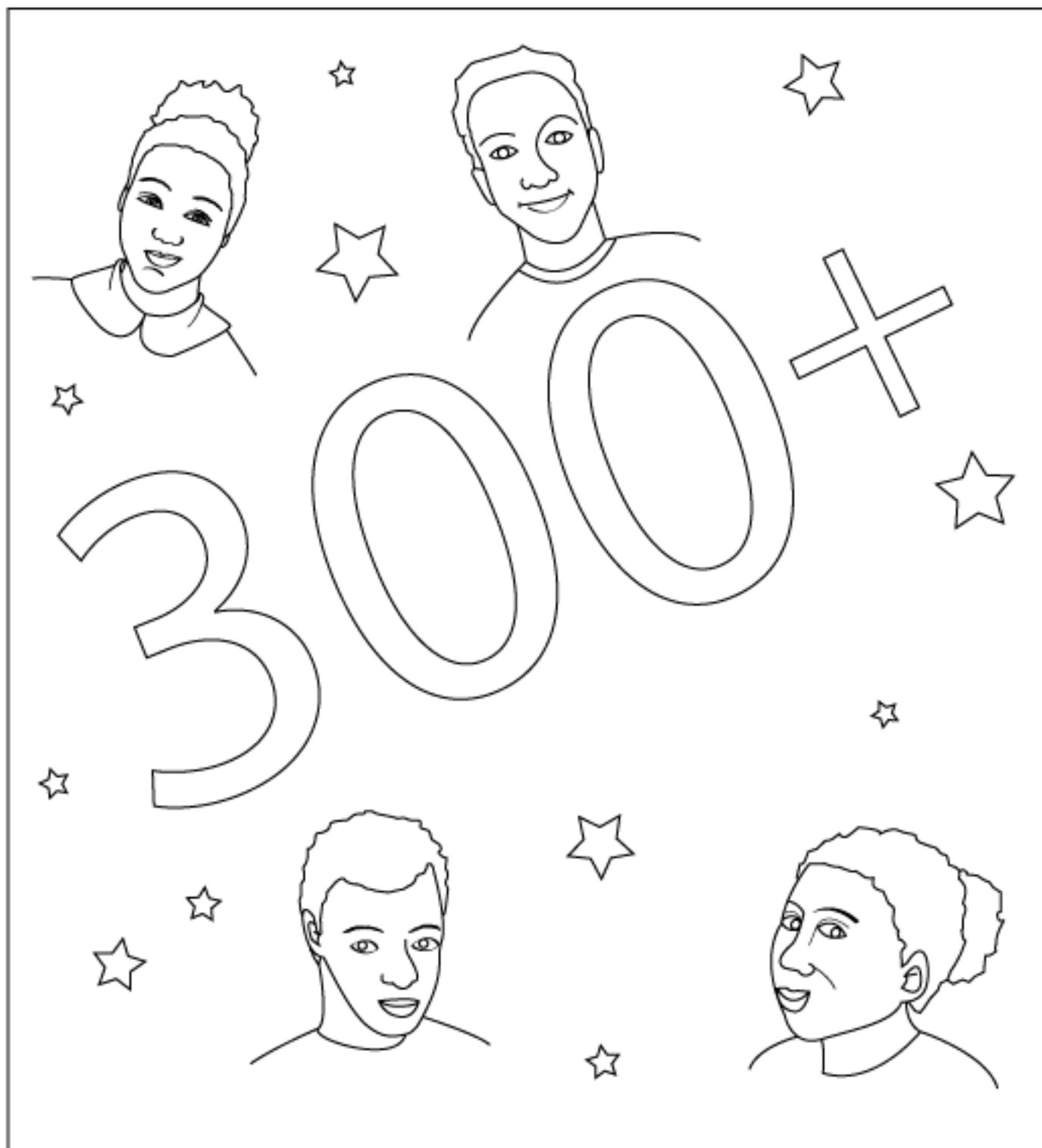
She was given the names of people who would

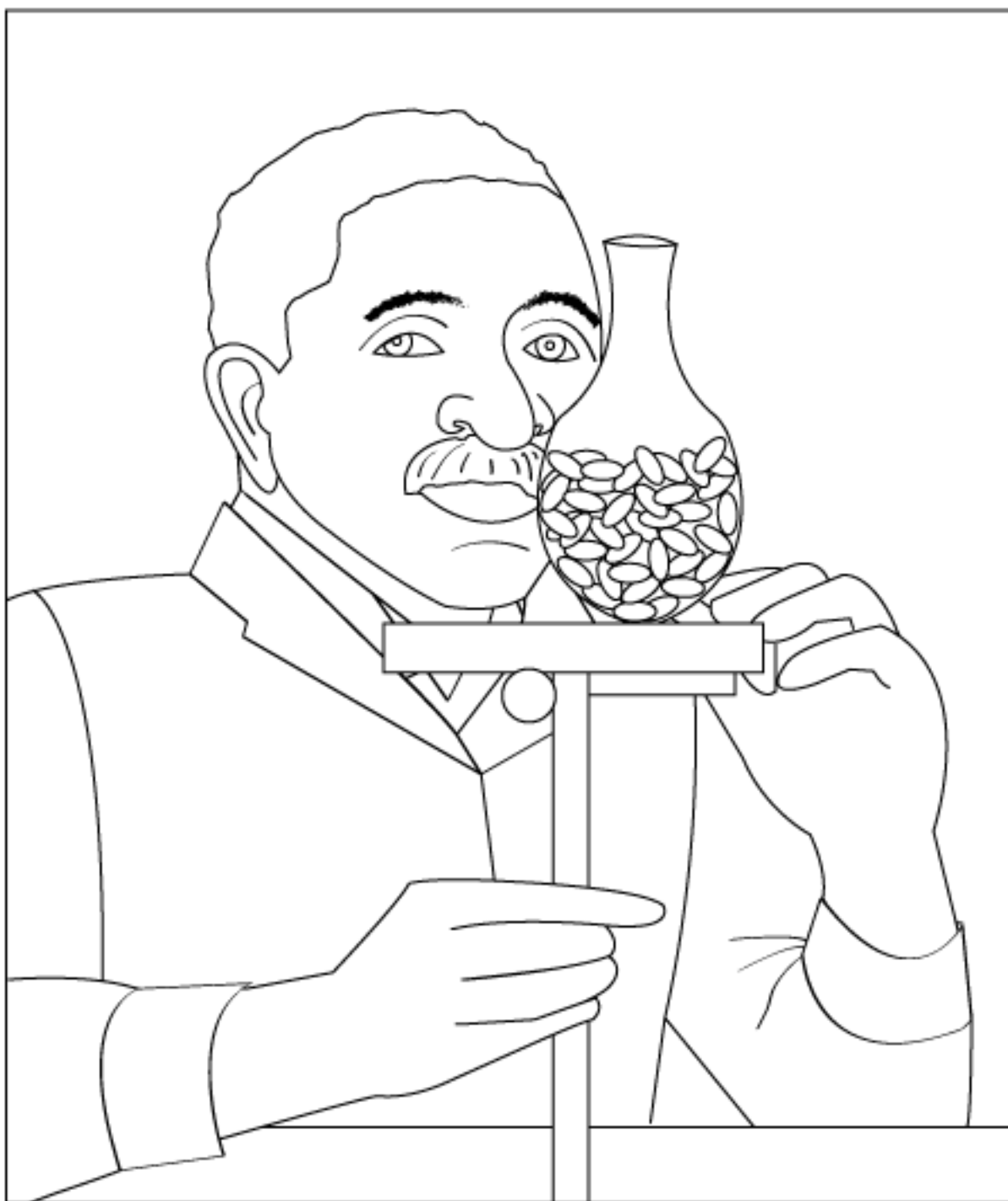
